Summary

- Unmodified audit opinion
- No findings
- General Fund had an increase in fund balance of \$ 1.1 million
- Food Service Fund had significantly improved results of operations.

Governmental Activities – Full Accrual

- Capital Assets decreased due to minimal purchases and projects in the current year
 - Depreciation expense exceeded capital asset additions by \$ 1,043,343
- Noncurrent liabilities decreased due to regular debt payments made during the year

General Fund Analysis

- Revenues were more than budget due to:
 - Taxes (earned income taxes) one time receipt
 - Total revenues \$ 950,000 more than 2013
- Expenditures were comparable to budget
 - Increased compared to 2013 due primarily to increase in PSERS rate (approximately \$ 340,000)
- Other Financing Sources and Uses
 - Capital lease proceeds were not budgeted (normal process is to only budget the payments)

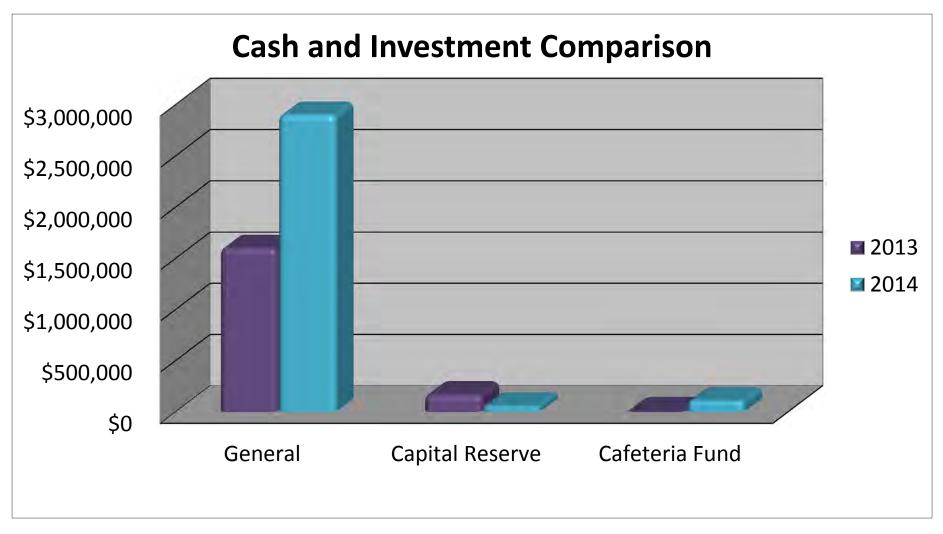
- Operating revenues declined in comparison to the previous year due to less meals sold (more free and reduced).

- No transfers from the General Fund in the current year.



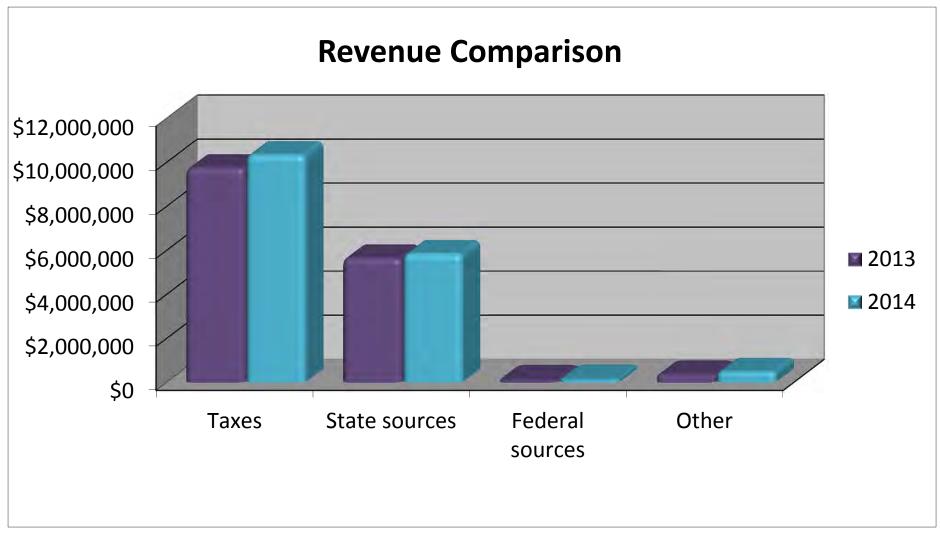

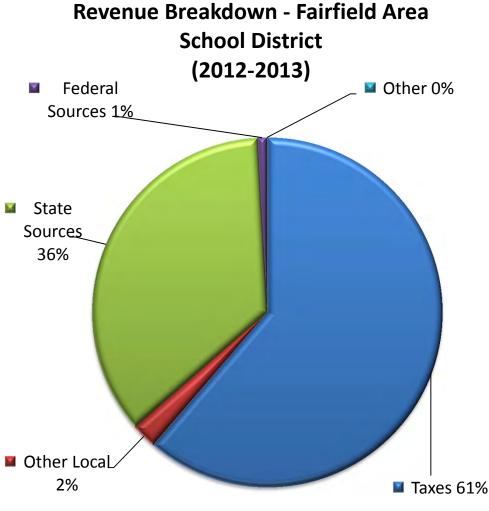






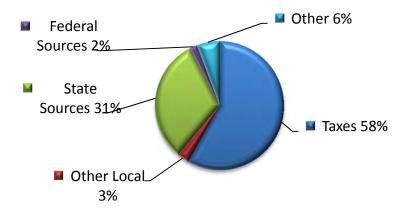




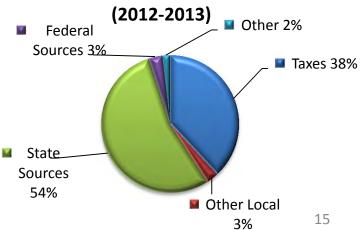


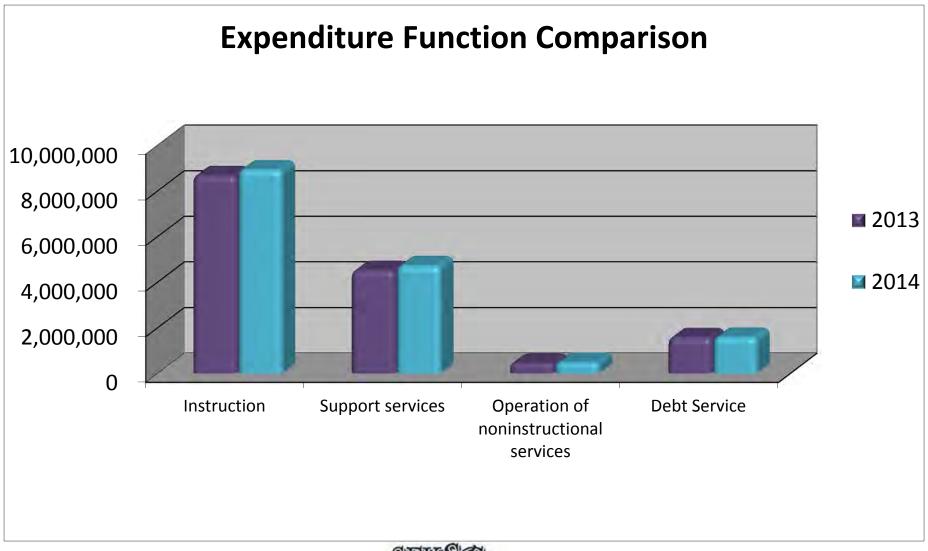
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Revenue Breakdown - LIU Schools (2012-2013)

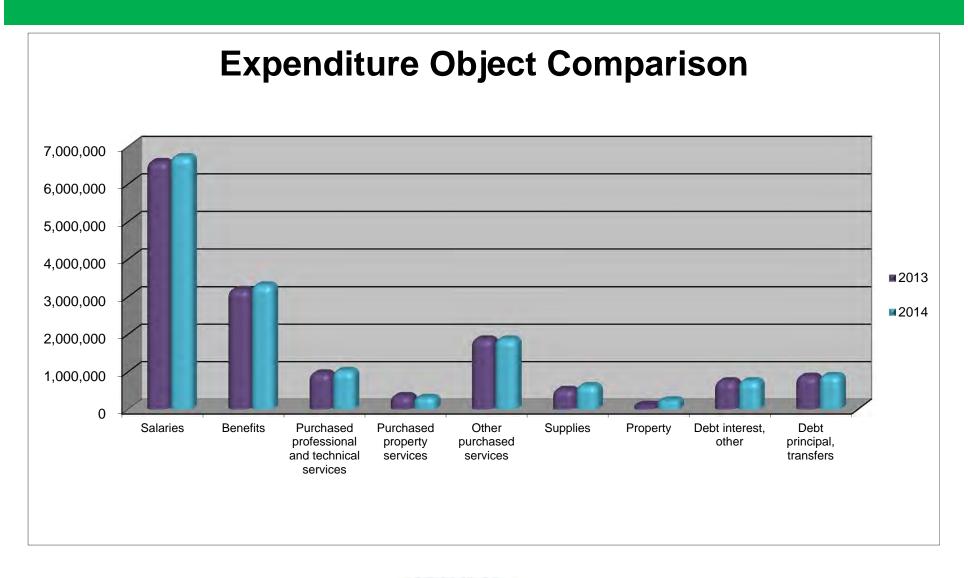


Revenue Breakdown - Schools with \$25 Million or Less of Revenue



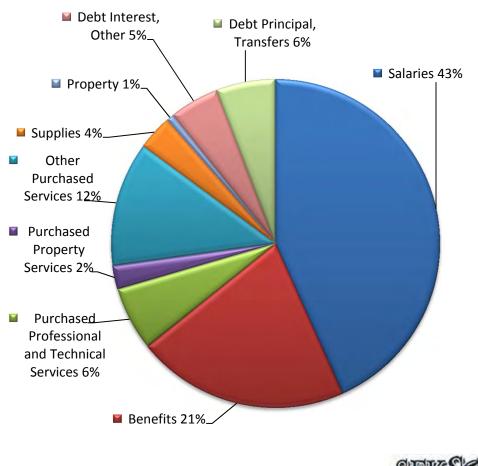




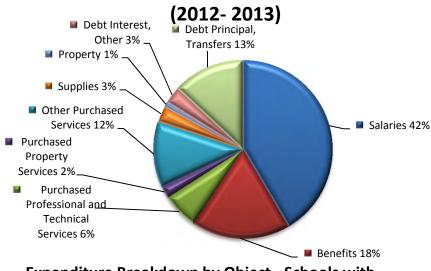




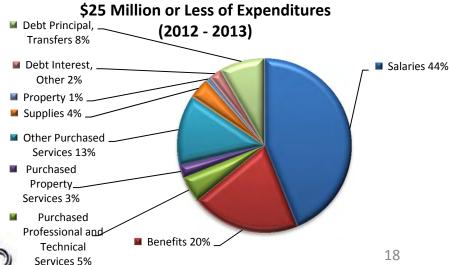




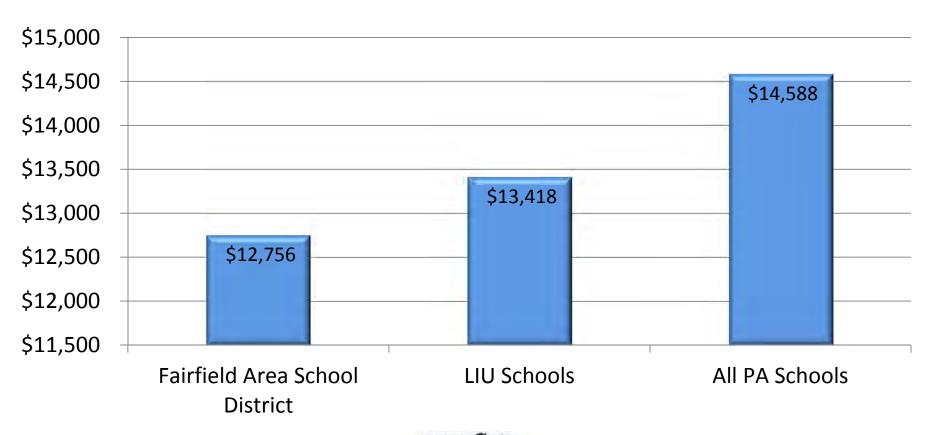
Expenditure Breakdown - LIU Schools



Expenditure Breakdown by Object - Schools with \$25 Million or Less of Expenditures

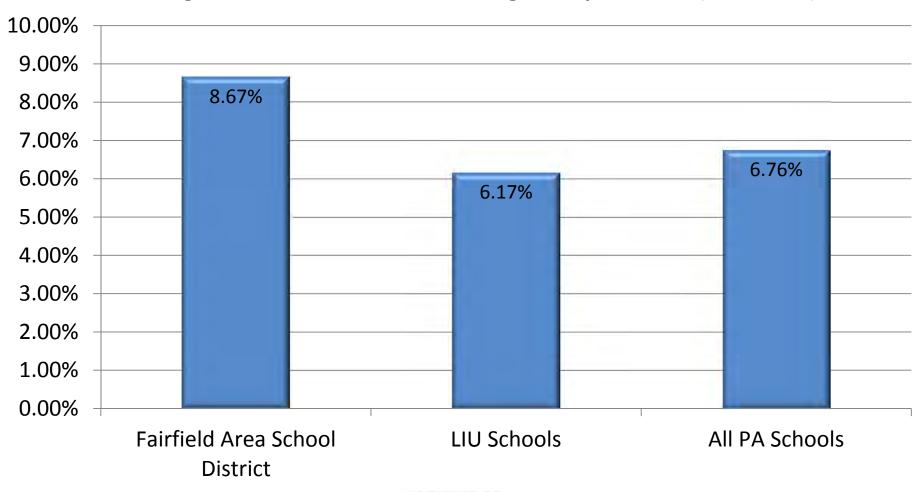


Expenditures per Average Daily Membership (2012-2013)



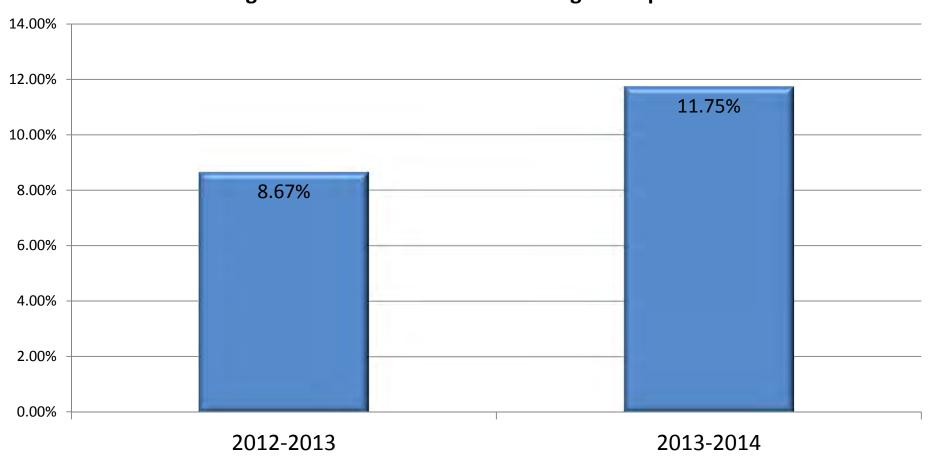


Unassigned Fund Balance as a Percentage of Expenditures (2012-2013)

 - This is a reduction of \$815,000 compared to last year

- GASB 68 Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions – Effective for 6/30/15 Year End
 - Governmental entities will record a net pension liability equal to the difference between the total pension liability and the value of the assets set aside in a pension plan to pay benefits to current employees, retirees and their beneficiaries.
 - The liability will NOT be reported in the General Fund;
 only the Government-Wide Statements and in the Food Service Fund.



- GASB 68 Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions – Effective for 6/30/15 Year End(continued)
 - The information required for this standard will come from PSERS and the District will record a liability based on its proportionate share of the PSERS liability. We will work with management to ensure proper implementation of the standard as it relates to the School District's financial statements.
 - Preliminary estimates indicate that liability may be three times the School District's covered payroll (approximately \$ 19,000,000).



Communication with Those Charged with Governance

- Required communications related to the audit
 - Includes the qualitative aspects of accounting practices, a description of any difficulties encountered during the audit, and a description of any disagreements with management.
 - Attached to the letter are the adjustments made for the audit, most prepared by management.
 - Also, addresses management representations,
 management consultations with other independent auditors, and other audit findings or issues.
